### Tasks

1. There are four sets of **Key Skills Sheets**, each of these is broken down into daily sets of questions. You must complete at **least one set of questions on your chosen key skill per day (10 questions)** but you could choose to complete one set of questions for each key skill (40 questions). Make sure that you choose a skill, or skills that you know you need to practice. Keeping your maths brains active whilst you are away from school is really important. These are PDF files so you won't be able to edit them but you can type your answers in a word document or write down your answers on paper.
2. Complete the **Colour Code Puzzle** by following the instructions on the sheet – you can complete this on screen by editing the slide or on paper if you choose to print it out.
3. Complete the questions in the **Problem-Solving Booklet** – again, these can be completed on screen or on paper. You will notice that the questions require you to think really creatively to work solve the problems – you will need to do a fair bit of working out! Don't worry if this takes time or if you feel like you come to a dead end – try leaving it and coming back to the problem when you've had a break. Some questions may need you to do a bit of research or make some educated guesses – if this is the case, just give it a try.
